### Summary Report

The Naan Mudhalvan (NM) courses, initiated by the Government of Tamilnadu, have been effectively implemented in our college to encourage students to enhance their skills through this opportunity. Here is an overview of the key steps taken in this successful implementation:

- 1. Faculty Training:** Initially, eight staff members from our college underwent training through Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs) organized by Manonmaniam Sundaranar University. This training equipped them with the necessary knowledge and skills to effectively mentor students in NM courses.
- 2. Expansion of Mentor Team:** Following the initial training, additional five staff members were trained to expand the mentor team. In total, thirteen staff members were designated as 'Mentors' for the NM courses.
- 3. Orientation Meeting:** An orientation meeting was organized to introduce the NM courses to the students. This meeting served as a platform to inform students about the courses, their benefits, and how they can participate.
- 4. Student Participation:** With the guidance of the mentor team, students were encouraged to participate in NM courses and make the most of this opportunity to develop their skills.

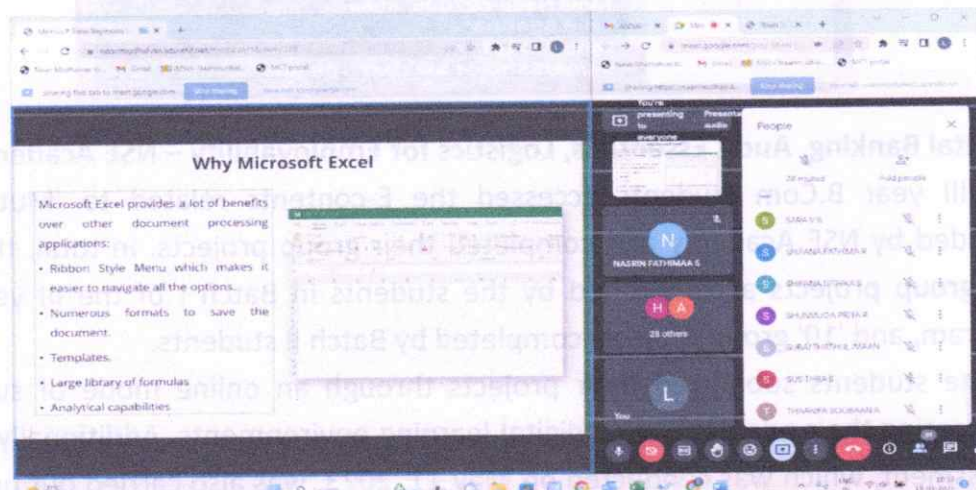
## **Branch-wise NM course implementation**

### **1. Language Proficiency for Employability**

A diagnostic test was administered to all first-year students, and they have successfully completed this assessment. Subsequently, based on their performance in the diagnostic test, students were assigned to either A2 or B1 courses. To gauge their progress and proficiency, a final Upskill test was conducted on April 28, 2023, through a mobile-based English test from Cambridge, assessed the students' proficiency in four essential language skills: speaking, writing, reading, and listening.

### **2. Digital Skills for Employability**

In the II year, 100% of the students successfully logged into the course portal and accessed the video course contents provided by our Microsoft training partner. The course itself was divided into three main components: Beginner, Advanced, and Cyber security. To evaluate their skills, the final assessment was conducted through online mode by the Microsoft portal for each and every unit. This ensured a comprehensive evaluation of the students' knowledge and proficiency in the course material.



### **3. Emerging Technology for Employability**

The III B.Sc. Computer Science students had the opportunity to access Cyber Security virtual classes offered by IZAPY through our Learning Management System (LMS). Impressively, all of the third-year students successfully completed the course. The final assessment, which took place on April 18, 2023, was conducted online, allowing for a complete evaluation of the students' understanding of the subject.

#### 4. Data Analytics with Advanced Tools for Employability

The final year students of B.Sc. Physics and B.Sc. Mathematics embarked on a Data Analytics course provided by 'SMARTBRIDGE.' All the students engaged with virtual video content that focused on utilizing 'TABLEAU' software for data analytics. Each student received individual login credentials from the 'SMARTBRIDGE' training partner and successfully completed their respective group projects. Their project presentations were conducted exceptionally well and recorded by their respective mentor staff.

The final assessment encompassed a theory test conducted virtually on May 4, 2023. Remarkably, all the students completed this test successfully. This reflects their dedication and proficiency in the Data Analytics course, demonstrating a high level of understanding and competence in the subject.



#### 5. Digital Banking, Audit Essentials, Logistics for Employability – NSE Academy

The III year B.Com students accessed the E-contents related to 'Mutual Fund' provided by NSE Academy and completed their group projects. In total, there were '11' group projects accomplished by the students in Batch I of the III year B.Com program, and '10' group projects completed by Batch II students.

All the students submitted their projects through an online mode of submission, showcasing their adaptability to digital learning environments. Additionally, the final assessment, which was conducted on May 11, 2023, was also carried out online. This demonstrates the students' ability to effectively navigate online resources and assessments, showcasing their competence in the 'Mutual Fund' course offered by NSE Academy.




## 6. Employability Readiness


